Proposals must include:

- Draft title
- Contact information for primary and co-presenters
- Abstract that provides enough specifics of the proposed presentations to show its premise, content, reference value, and intended audience

If a panel format is proposed, it should include proposed co-panelist, with full names and titles and contact information.

Session Selection Process

The conference content committee will review all valid proposals submitted by potential speakers. The selection of presenters will be based upon the reputation of the presenter(s), information contained in the submittal, the session's value to conference attendees and consumers and the promotion of local experts. Submitters will be

contacted individually about their session, accepted or not. The decision of the content committee is final.
